

HORSE CHESTNUT

Aesculus hippocastanum

IDENTIFICATION

Large, showy, deciduous tree reaching 50-80 ft tall with a round crown. Large palmate leaves are opposite, divided into 5-7 leaflets with finely toothed margins. Tall, white spikes of large, white flowers with yellow and red spots. Fruit is round, prickly capsule with 1-3 smooth, brown seeds.

IMPACTS

Once established, competes with native species for sunlight, moisture, and nutrients. Seeds, leaves, and sprouts are highly toxic and can cause death.



Manual: Girdle 10 cm band of bark and phloem layer from around trunk. Damage to xylem could cause suckering. Chemical: apply herbicide to cut stems; retreat suckers. Follow all label instructions and wear appropriate protective equipment. Replace with Oregon white oak or Pacific dogwood.
