Bringing Nature Home: Using habitat restoration techniques in the gardenby Tom Kaye

Discussion on habitat restoration of grasslands in Western Oregon and how these practices can be down-scaled to home gardening, such as replacing lawns with native prairie. Further, how to select the plants for this process and maximize their benefit to native invertebrates, including pollinators.

Backyard Bees of Oregon by August Jackson

A Brief exploration of the bees that live in Oregon (800 species), with a focus on those that can be found in Willamette Valley gardens. We'll take a closer look at several species to gain a better understanding of their lives and livelihoods.



Myceilium and Pollinators Symbiotic Nature by Anjel Craig

The important role of pollinators for the life cycle of angiosperm plants is well established and documented as one of the most well-known symbioses in nature. However, pollinators are engaged in less well-known but still as important symbiosis with fungi. Let's discuss the emerging literature and research about how fungi interact with pollinators and how to implement these fugal assistants in your own garden and pollinator projects.
